

Rule:

This week we have been learning to spell words that have the 's' sound but are spelled using the letters 'sc'

We learned that many of these words come from Latin but that the Romans would have pronounced it as 's' 'k' not as 's'. We know we pronounce these words with a 's' sound.

Now that we want children to start putting their spelling words into their English work, we will be revisiting all the spellings we have learnt so far this year so that they become used to using these words.

Write each of these words four times in your homework book to help you learn them. Don't forget to use different spelling strategies to help you remember them.

Handwriting focus:

This week, we would like you to practice your joins. Write 5 sentences based on our class book St George and the Dragon using your spelling words but making sure to join you letters. Remember we don't join from capital letters and the letters f, j, g, y. These sentences will then be useful for their final piece on this book next week!
