

Spelling Rule:

This week, we have been looking at the suffix 'ly'

The suffix –ly is added to an adjective to form an adverb.

If the root word ends with –ic, –ally is added rather than just –ly, *except* in the word publicly.

If the root word ends with –e we remove the –e and replace with -ly
