Sentence grammar focus:

Please choose five words. For each word, write a sentence that includes a fronted adverbial. Remember that a fronted adverbial is a short description of the verb and appears at the beginning of the sentence. It normally has a comma straight after it too.

EXAMPLE: *Before dinner*, we watched a television programme.

Here, the fronted adverbial is in red and the verb is underlined. It helps to describe when we watched television. Other fronted adverbials could be: suddenly, during playtime, nervously.

Don't forget to use a comma to separate the fronted adverbial from the main part of the sentence!
