

Spelling Rule:

This week, we would like you to look at words that end in the suffix –cian which sounds like ‘shun’.

We use the suffix ‘cian’ when we want to change the noun (root word) into a profession **For example music – musician and beauty – beautician**

We have also included some common exception words as well.
