

Week 3 – 19.11.21 – More practise with prefixes il, im, ir, and in

Rule: Next week we will learn more prefix words particularly -il, -im, -ir, and -in.

We know if the root word begins with 'l' we use **-il** .

If the root word begins with 'r' add **-ir**.

If the root words begins with 'm' or 'p' add **-im**

Now that we want children to start putting their spelling words into their English work, we will be revisiting all the spellings we have learnt so far this year.
