Robert Burns was born on 25th January 1759.


He wrote many famous poems and songs.

Robert Burns was born on 25th January 1759 in Alloway, Scotland. He wrote many famous poems about issues that were important to him.

He wrote the famous song 'Auld Lang Syne' which is sung on New Year's Eve.

In Scotland, he is also known as Rabbie Burns or 'The Bard' which means poet and is a Scottish icon.


Burns Night

Burns Night is celebrated on or around the 25th January. People gather together to eat haggis, neeps and tatties. Haggis is a type of sausage stored inside a sheep's stomach, neeps are turnips and tatties are potatoes.

Dessert is usually a dish called cranachan which is whipped cream mixed with raspberries and oat cakes.

After the meal, many of Robert Burns's poems and songs are read and performed, such as 'My Love is like a Red, Red Rose' and 'Tam o'Shanter.'

Traditionally, male guests wear kilts and women wear dresses or skirts in their family tartan.



Burns Night is celebrated around the world every year. It is a time when people remember a famous Scottish poet called Robert Burns.

Burns Night

Many people hold a Burns supper on or around his birthday. It may be a large, organised event or a small gathering of family and friends. The menu consists of haggis, neeps and tatties.

Haggis, which is presented to the guests on a silver platter, is a type of sausage stored inside a sheep's stomach. Neeps are turnips or a swede which is cooked and mashed and tatties are potatoes.

After the meal, guests are entertained by singers or musicians who perform some of Robert Burns's poems and songs, such as 'My Love is Like a Red, Red Rose' and 'Tam o'Shanter.' Traditionally, male guests wear kilts and women wear dresses or skirts in their family tartan.

Did You Know...?

Tartan is a heavy woollen cloth woven to make different patterns. The patterns and colours of the tartan represent different areas of Scotland or families.



Robert Burns

Robert Burns, the eldest of seven children, was born on 25th January 1759 in Alloway, Scotland.

He wrote many famous poems about political issues that were very important to him.

His most famous song is '**Auld Lang Syne**' which is sung across the world at midnight on New Year's Eve in order to welcome in the new year.

Robert Burns is an important historical figure in Scotland and is sometimes referred to as Rabbin Burns or '**The Bard**', which means poet in Scots.
