

For swimming, we go to our local swimming pool Janet Adegoke, and our children take part in swimming courses. Our Year Three classes attended a ten-session intensive course and were given the confidence to swim in a full-size pool and taught the three basic strokes: front crawl, breaststroke and backstroke. We also offer a swimming course to our Year Six children. They attended a five-session intensive course and were assessed against the National Curriculum standards.
